The modern Emergency Department (ED) is a 24-hour, 365-day-a-year services designed to provide immediate care for persons requiring medical attention. Historically, EDs have been associated with tertiary-care facilities, but in the U.S. today EDs are increasingly found in smaller community hospitals, which are also serving as the primary facilities for other specialties such as family medicine, cardiology, neurology, orthopedics, etc. Primary physicians generally refer their patients who are severely ill, but the need for emergency care may be delayed or the referral may come late. In order to provide emergency services, the primary providers must ensure that there are adequate hospitals in the community for the ED to receive patients. This article reviews the transition from the once referred-to secondary hospital to the now referred-to primary hospital, and describes the role of the secondary hospital in emergency services.
